The twentieth century Russian philosopher and literary theorist Mikhail Bakhtin wrote extensively on the concept of dialogue. Although Bakhtin's work took many different directions over the course of his life, dialogue always remained the "master key" to understanding his worldview. Bakhtin described the open-ended dialogue as "the single adequate form for verbally expressing authentic human life". Bakhtin's primary works include *Toward a Philosophy of the Act*, an unfinished portion of a philosophical essay; *Problems of Dostoyevsky's Art*, to which Bakhtin later added a chapter on the concept of carnival and published with the title *Problems of Dostoyevsky's Poetics*; *Rabelais and His World*, which explores the openness of the Rabelaisian novel; *The Dialogic Imagination*, whereby the four essays that comprise the work introduce the concepts of dialogism, heteroglossia, and chronotope ...

Mikhail M. Bakhtin (1895–1975) is increasingly being recognized as one of the major literary theorists of the twentieth century. He is perhaps best known for his radical philosophy of language, as well as his theory of the novel, underpinned by concepts such as “dialogism,” “polyphony,” and “carnival,” themselves resting on the more fundamental concept of “heteroglossia.”.

The Dialogic Imagination is Mikhail Bakhtin's examination of the novel. The book describes the novel as a new genre, one that is relatively new and immature. This is despite being written in the 1930s, when we would normally think of the novel as being much more stable.

Bakhtin further developed this theory of polyphony, or "dialogics," in *Voprosy literatury i estetiki* (1975; *The Dialogic Imagination*), in which he postulated that, rather than being static, language evolves dynamically and is affected by and affects the culture that produces and uses it.

Bakhtin's ideas about dialogism vs monologism. — uncanni. Next, I don't think that Bakhtin intended to reduce his vision of the dialogic just to the literary, or imaginary world.
