Oncology Nursing Part 1: Surgical and Radiation Oncology ...

Professionals involved in the care of patients receiving radiation therapy include radiation oncologists, cancer nurses specializing in radiation, physicists, radiation therapists, dosimetrists, clinical trial specialists, social workers, dietitians, care coordinators, and spiritual advisors. A radiation oncologist orders radiation therapy.

Safety precautions used in caring for a patient receiving brachytherapy include assigning the patient to a private room, posting appropriate notices about radiation safety precautions, having staff members wear dosimeter badges, making sure that pregnant staff members are not assigned to the patient's care, prohibiting visits by children and pregnant visitors, limiting visits from others to 30 minutes daily, and seeing that visitors maintain a 6 foot distance from the radiation source.

Most places require patients to be seen once every 5 treatments. You go over side effects with patients and review options to relieve symptoms (gel pads for Breast, Aquaphor, 100% Aloe, etc.), make sure they have their meds, assessments, and patient education. In Radiation, there is A LOT of patient education.

In 1990, the Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) Radiation Therapy Special Interest Group (RT SIG) established a work group in an effort to improve and standardize the documentation of nursing care provided to patients receiving radiation therapy. The Radiation Oncology Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant (NP/PA) will work closely with a team of two physicians and a registered nurse (our department care team model), evaluating outpatient Radiation Oncology patients for treatment, contributing to the treatment plan, and managing the care of patients undergoing radiation therapy.

The Staff Nurse will utilize knowledge of chemotherapy and radiation oncology procedures to assess, screen, evaluate, educate and provide care management/outcome management in accordance with professional nursing standards to adult patients who are under the care of the Outpatient Oncology Services team.

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
